FR. JOHN’S COMMENTS

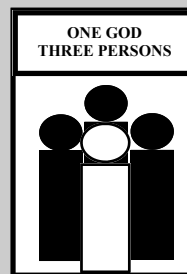
“Who’s Your Daddy?”

Paul Farhi, staff writer of the Washington Post, explains that Red Sox pitcher, Pedro Martinez, in discussing his frustrations about pitching against the Yankees, said: *“I can’t find a way to beat them at this point. What can I say? I just tip my hat and call the Yankees my daddy.”* A few weeks later, in Game 2 of the American League playoffs, 60,000 Yankees fans taunted Martinez by chanting, *“Who’s your daddy?”*

Today is Father’s Day and it is also the Feast of the Holy Trinity. So, rather than as a taunt, I ask the question as a challenge: *Who’s your daddy? Is God your Daddy or not?* Are we made in the image and likeness of God or not? If God is Trinity and if we are made in God’s image, what about Trinity is true of you and of me?

The Blessed Trinity is not just a mystery. It is a mystery that allows us to understand more fully how Jesus can have both the God Life and a human life at the same time. It is a mystery that allows us to understand better how we can inherit the abundant and everlasting life of God when we go to the grave. If the Father person, the Son person and the Holy Spirit person can all share the one identical God Life at the same time, then that same God Life could also be shared with you and me.

The key to understanding Trinity (in an acceptable way) is to quit thinking that *persons* are part of the life that they possess. Think of persons like shadows that are inseparable from the object that is casting the shadow. Look at the image to the right. The figure in the middle is casting the three shadows that surround it. The three shadows are the *persons* who possess the one figure in the middle--the *life*.



Now, imagine that this mortal life of yours is casting a shadow who is the person, *you*. *You*, the True Person, is temporarily being hosted by this mortal form of life that is going to the grave. Then, *you*, the True Person, will be assumed to share the whole abundant and everlasting God Life with the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Pray that this truth be your new way of looking at your existence now and after you lose this mortal life. You will not go away. You will not "move out of the neighborhood." God lives right here and *you*, the person, will inherit everything and everyone you now cherish.
